Entry Submissions	<p>Hy-Tek entries will be accepted via SNC web upload only.</p> <p>Entry Deadline: November 10th, 2025 at 12:00 AM. Entries will not be accepted after the deadline.</p> <p>All athletes must be registered as competitive swimmers with Swimming Canada (SNC) and have a valid SC registration number. Entries without valid SC registration SNC registration number and registration status will be declined entry</p> <p>Once the entry file is uploaded, an email confirming the meet entries will be sent to the club. Once received, the club has 24 hours to review this file and make corrections/modifications to entries. Entry time, event additions, or change of event will NOT be accepted after this period.</p> <p>Deck entries will NOT be accepted. Swimmers who miss a heat shall not be accommodated for that event in subsequent heats.</p> <p>Meet management will NOT accept requests for official splits.</p>

<p>Facility Rules</p>	<p>Proper footwear and clothing must be worn throughout the building (outside pool area). No outdoor footwear is allowed on deck. All swimmers must shower before entering the pool. In case of a building emergency (e.g., power failure, etc.) swimmers are asked to clear the pool immediately and exit the building. All coaches shall meet in a designated area with the meet management for further instructions.</p> <p>Credit Union Place lifeguards will be on duty.</p> <p>The leisure pool and hot tub are strictly off-limits.</p> <p>In respect to those with allergies, please note that this meet is peanut and nut free.</p>
<p>Eligibility</p>	<p>Swimmers who are members of SNC are eligible. There are no qualifying standards.</p>
<p>Entries</p>	<p>Entries must be submitted through the SNC online entries system at www.swimming.ca.</p> <p>Age Categories: 12 & Under, 13-14, 15 & over</p> <p>Swimmers may swim up to three individual events per session, plus the Eliminator.</p> <p>A swimmer's age is determined on the first day of the meet.</p> <p>Meet management reserves the right to limit entries in any event in order to meet the timelines of the meet schedule.</p> <p>Swimmers may enter either the 800 Free or 1500 Free, not both. Each event will be limited to one heat consisting of the top six seeds. Meet management reserves the right to combine genders for distance events dependent on entries and timelines.</p>
<p>Meet Format</p>	<p>Session 1- preliminary event; Session 2- finals A and B , Session 3- timed finals. A final only if fewer than 6 entries.</p> <p>There shall be no charge for missed swims or step downs.</p> <p>Events will be seeded according to entry times.</p> <p>Backstroke ledges will be available for use if feasible.</p> <p>Meet program will be available on meet mobile, if feasible.</p> <p>Results will be available 24 hours after meet if possible, barring any unforeseen circumstances.</p>

Meet Package	The only meet package which will be considered as valid must be the most current version found on www.swimming.ca
Entry Fee	<p>Swimmer Fee: Flat Fee of \$95.00 per swimmer</p> <p>Fees are due prior to warm-up. Please make cheques payable to SDSC or e-transfer to sdsctreasurer@summersidedolphins.com indicating the team's name in the transfer.</p> <p>The amount due is based on the entries confirmed as of the entry deadline of November 10th, 2025 at 24:00 AT. Fees are due prior to the warm-up on November 22nd, 2025.</p>
Warm Up	Warm-ups may be split according to entries. The split will be determined and forwarded to teams once entries have been received.

Scratches	Scratches will not be accepted on day of meet
Dive Starts	As per the Facility Rules for Dive Starts, starts will be conducted from starting platforms (blocks) as per Aquatic C4.1 and SNC4.1
Officials	<p>Meet officials are needed. Please email Matt Reid at mattreid101@hotmail.com to volunteer.</p> <p>Safety marshals are to arrive ten minutes before the start of warm-up.</p> <p>Officials Briefing Meeting will be held during warm up, on deck.</p>
Spectators	Swimmers will be given priority to bleacher seating.
Coaches	Coaches must be registered with the Canadian Swimming Coaches Association (CSCA). The CSCA certification card will be required for deck access and should be visible on deck or as required.

<p>Open and Observable Environment</p>	<p>Swimming Canada and Swim PEI are dedicated to providing a safe and inclusive environment, which involves promoting Open and Observable Environments. This means making meaningful and concerted efforts to avoid situations where a coach/official/staff member, etc. might be alone with an athlete. All interactions between an athlete and an individual who is in a position of trust should normally, and wherever possible, be in an environment or space that is both 'open' and 'observable' to others.</p>
<p>Event Photography and Videography</p>	<p>To minimize risk, all photographs and video taken at Swimming Canada/Swim PEI sanctioned competitions, whether taken by a professional photographer or videographer, spectator, team support staff, or any other participant, must observe generally accepted standards of decency. Under no circumstances are cameras or other recording devices allowed in the area immediately behind the starting blocks during practice or competition starts, or in locker rooms, bathrooms, or any other dressing area.
